

The FIRST ANNUAL Festival of Trees IS A SUCCESS !!

On November 28th after weeks and months of blood, sweat, tears, laughter and sheer determination, a new holiday tradition was given a warm community reception. Volunteers began preparation last July and quickly came to the conclusion that we should have started earlier. When the last star was hung and all the preparations were completed the volunteers quickly changed clothes and the festival opened on Friday night. Over a hundred people arrived to enjoy the sparkling lights and beautiful decorations on thirty-one carefully arranged and decorated trees.

The Gala Opening featured delicious hors d'oeuvres, cheeses, and fancy desserts from Star Catering and wine served by Bridgeview Vineyards. There was lively music from "The Applegations" and an auction of the beautifully decorated trees led by Lee Nelson of Liska Associates. In addition to the trees, an original bronze by sculptor, Laran Ghiglieri, was auctioned to benefit Options. The piece was called "Natures Treasures" and included 30 carats of precious stones, with an appraised value of over \$100,000.

The spirit of the evening was certainly festive. Weary, but excited volunteers and arriving guests strolled the display and carefully viewed the amazing details of the individual trees. Each tree was decorated with a theme. The varied themes ran the gamut from "America the Beautiful" to "Celebrating our World" to the "Upside Down Tree", which was hung and decorated, literally, upside down. Volunteer teams of decorators spent hours finding ornaments that reflected their theme and even more hours hanging and attaching them. Every ornament had to be wired on so that the tree could be moved while fully decorated.

By Sunday night when the trees were gone and the decorations down and packed away, there was a warm feeling of relief for a successful festival and eager anticipation of a bigger and better event next year.



Options Clinical Director appointed to Governor's Task Force

Jeff Krolick, Options Clinical Director, was appointed to serve on the Governor's Task Force. In October the Governor issued an executive order creating the Taskforce with the mission to review, analyze, and recommend changes to the State of Oregon's public mental health system in order to preserve and improve services for Oregonians with severe emotional and psychiatric disorders.

"Particularly in these financially challenging times, we need to ensure that Oregon's mental health system is effective and accountable, that it is reaching those most in need and that we are providing the best possible care," said the Governor. "With the support of the legislature and mental health experts from around the state, this taskforce should provide us with a blueprint to accomplish those goals."

Jeff, the only representative from Southern Oregon, will join nineteen other mental health professionals, lawmakers and others from around the state. The Taskforce will provide a final report to the Governor's Office and to the Emergency Board of the Legislative Assembly no later than January 1, 2005 with the findings and recommendations of the Taskforce and an action plan for the implementation of those recommendations in the 2005-07 biennium.
